Why Human Services?

The broad field of Human Services leads to many exciting opportunities and career paths. Graduates of the program have had the opportunity to work with individuals who are young, old, have special needs, have substance abuse issues, are in need of home care, and much more. Classes provide instruction in the various fields associated with working with people. Many students completing the Human Services Program continue their education and obtain bachelor and master level degrees in Human Services and allied professions.

The Human Services Program prepares students to enter occupations in public and private human services agencies; acquire skills and knowledge related to the student's current human services employment; and pursue further studies leading to advanced academic degrees and special certifications. Students wishing to specialize in Gerontology can elect to enroll in the Human Services degree with a concentration in Gerontology.
